Old business:

- B. During the Open House, members of the guild can sell things to raise money. Gary will ask Bill Armstrong to okay it. A percentage of the proceeds would go to the guild.**
- C. We still would like to have someone run a website for the guild. Ann said she could set it up but not maintain it. Gary said it would be static, with minimal changes in the future. Hopefully we can find a free site. Jesse suggested Photosite.com to help manage photos. He said he would check it to see if he thinks it would work.
Ann said she would meet Mike at the library to work on the website.**

- D. Our guild year starts in March, so everyone needs to start thinking about whether he or she would like to be an officer.**
