The meeting began at 6:00. Susan read the minutes from the last meeting. One correction: Jesse uses a scroll saw, not a skill saw. Mike moved that the minutes be approved and Shirley seconded the motion.

Treasurer's report: We have a total of \$327.30.

Old business:

1. Upcoming Art Show: Report from Gary

a. Summary of entries compared to previous year (keep in mind that six more artists are going to enter items):

b. We probably won't get the 10' by 3' banners.

c. Vendors: The marketing department has gotten a few vendors for us. Pepsi will contribute the drinks and Quiznos will contribute the food. We will supply the paper goods and Shirley, Katie, and Susan will bring baked goods.

D. Sandy Koontz is willing to open the library at 1:00 p.m. on Sunday (Oct. 15) so that we can set up. The layout probably won't change from last year.

e. Gary has requested a third set of panels.

2. Quarterly Display:

- a. Mike spoke to Sandy Koontz about the displays. She is concerned about space. She said she is willing to take down artwork already in the library if we need the room to display ours. She has an easel that can be used and said the carousel by the desk can be used. She will move the chair by pillar next to the reading room if we find a curio cabinet that will fit the space. The cabinet could not be bigger than 39 inches wide and 20 inches deep. We also have access to the display windows by the front door. She (Sandy) is willing and able to help us.**
- b. Katie asked if we will be able to use tables and skirting from the club. Gary said yes.**
- c. The Youth Center asked to have the 12 and under category broken down into two categories; 9 and under, and 10-12, with first through third place ribbons for each category. Gary said we are unable to do this because the request came on the day the registration forms were due. We don't know the ages of all the people who had already submitted forms, so would not be able to separate them into the appropriate category. Everything is already formatted to 12 and under as one category. Also, awards aren't given in this category because children who don't win may not want to submit anything the next year. Therefore, participation certificates are given to all the artists in that category.**
- d. Sandy has mentioned that the display panels used during the art show or even during the quarterly display need to be placed out of line-of-sight between the**

desk and the computer room because whoever is working needs to be able to see into the computer room at all times.
